The Bisbee Community Sustainability Commission met yesterday following a request from the Streets and Infrastructure Committee to consider the use of glyphosate as proposed in a presentation made by Stephen Dey. The use of an herbicide is recommended to stop the growth of Bermuda grass and other weeds from growing in asphalt and concrete cracks in the city streets causing the paving to break up.

The Commission recommends that applications of glyphosate with a dye to show where it is, be made in the streets where weeds are growing and along the edge of the streets, but not further than 12" and that the chemical be 2.5% or less of the carrying liquid (water). Also that recommended procedures to protect those applying the chemical be used.
