



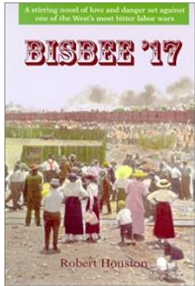

## DEPORTATION CENTENNIAL BOOK DISCUSSION w/ AUTHOR



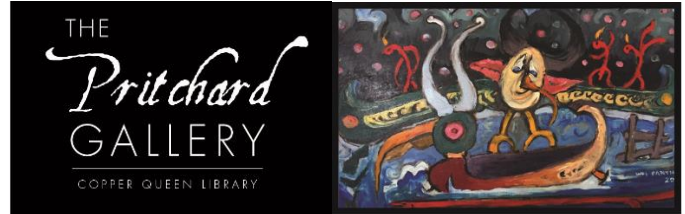
As a part of our library's Centennial Celebration of the Bisbee Deportation, we will be reading and discussing Robert Houston's book, *Bisbee '17* which dramatizes the illegal kidnapping and deportation of about 1,200 striking mine workers, their supporters, and citizen bystanders by 2,000 members of a deputized posse on July 12, 1917. The discussion will be facilitated by the author, Robert Houston, who will also give a reading from the book. Books will be available for checkout at the front desk prior to the discussion. Discussion: Monday, July 10, 2017 at 5:30 PM in the CQ Living Room.

## LIBRARY AWARDED \$5000 GRANT

The CQ Library was awarded \$5000 for a Collections and Programs Grant from the Arizona State Library to update and expand our Health and Wellness Collection. We will be working with the Cochise County Health Department, Chiricahua Community Health Center, and the Copper Queen Community Hospital staffs to compile a list of materials that will benefit the Bisbee community. We will also be working with the Cochise County Community Health Assessment, which was completed earlier this year, to target areas of special concern. As a part of this grant, we will also be offering programs related to health and wellness, for both children and adults. We will keep you posted as we develop this collection and expand our library programming.

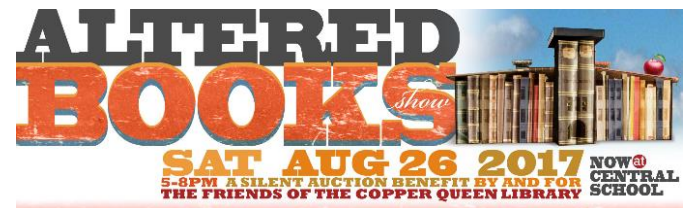
