All month long, library patrons are encouraged to pay off their overdue fines with cans of food (and other non-perishable food items). Each food item donated will count as \$1.00 toward your overdue fines. There will be no change given and food items cannot be used to pay off lost or damaged library materials. Library patrons are encouraged to donate food even if they don't have fines. Feel free to drop off items at the library circulation desk.

It requires recognizing attribution of cause and effect and careful consideration of the likely outcomes of harm to others. Future generations will have their quality of life impacted through the loss of species habitat and with it many of the creatures that have inspired us for millennia. In this presentation and discussion, we will pursue these and other philosophical and ethical questions that confront us today with human caused global warming.”


PROJECT GUTENBERG
