**Monday, May 14 | 2 – 4 PM | Starting the Job Search**



Workshops are free and open to everyone. Come to one, two or all three!


## SUMMER READING STARTS WEDNESDAY, JUNE 6<sup>TH</sup>

## SUMMER MOVIES IN THE PARK KICKS OFF SATURDAY MAY 19





# Library HotSpot

## CHECK OUT THE INTERNET!

Patrons of the Copper Queen Library will **soon** be able to check out an internet hotspot thanks to a grant from the Arizona State Library. With this program, students can use the internet at home for help with school work, job seekers can search and apply for jobs, and patrons can have home access to the library's digital resources such as our research databases, eBooks, and digital magazines, as well as general access to the internet. All you need is a WiFi enabled device such as a laptop or smart phone and a library card and no fines on your library account. You must be at least eighteen years old and not have internet service at home. The devices may be checked out for two weeks at a time and may be renewed once for another two weeks. Patrons will be asked to sign a contract before checking out the device and will be held responsible for the device during the checkout period. Devices not returned will be disabled remotely.
