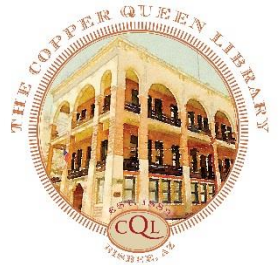


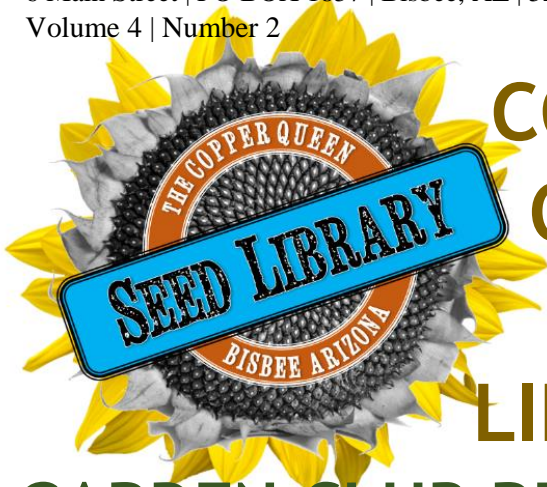

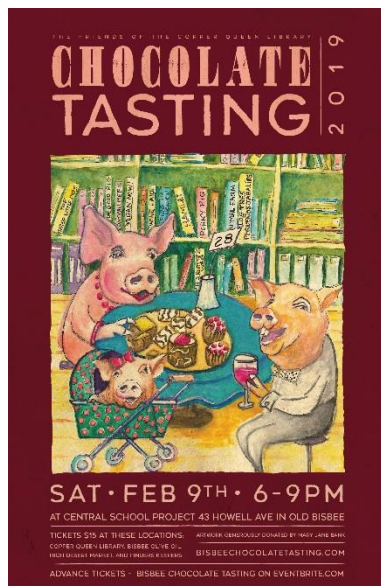
Remember the Garden Club meets every second Tuesday of the month at 2 PM in the Library's Meeting Room.

Under the Tree (Icelandic: *Undir trénu*) is a 2017 Icelandic dark comedy drama film directed by Hafsteinn Gunnar Sigurðsson. The movie follows a man who is accused of adultery and forced to move in with his parents. While he fights for custody of his four-year-old daughter, he is gradually sucked into a dispute between his parents and their neighbors over an old and beautiful tree. What starts as a typical spat between suburban neighbors unexpectedly and violently reaches a boiling point, soon spiraling out of control. ModCon: Modern-Contemporary Dance is a combination of classical techniques from Dunham, Graham, and Cunningham to Luigi jazz style. KIDS YOGA & MINDFULNESS w/ Sharon Stetter

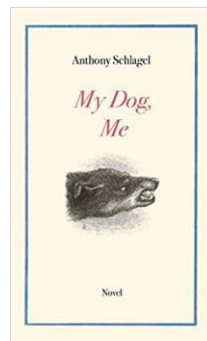

My, Dog, Me

THE AUTHOR: Bisbee local Anthony Schlagel grew up pastorally and anachronistically in rural Minnesota. He migrated west with the wagon trains to San Francisco where he studied poetry. To support himself he drove a taxi cab for several years at night. He then traveled eastward to Tennessee to become a librarian. He currently lives in Bisbee.

THE BOOK: *My Dog, Me* is a striking tale of being a loose cannon at a loose end. It presents a wholly new, and honest, take on what it is to be American-and every American should know about it. Ousted by his girlfriend, Nick takes himself-and his bicycle-to New Orleans, where he sulks and cycles, prey to vivid dreams and anxieties. Along with an antiquated interest in letter-writing, he shows an unexpected knack for collage. But undercurrents of racial and sexual disharmony alarm him on his wobbly journeys around town, and even the dogs seem critical.
