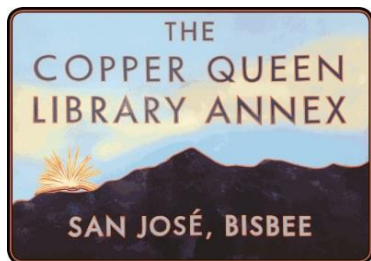

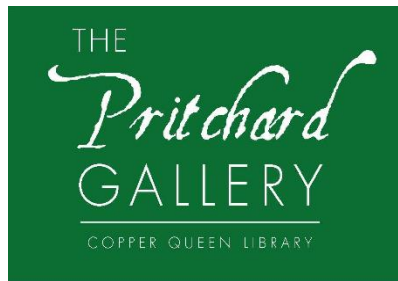

The goal of the Copper Queen Seed Library is to form and encourage a learning community centered around the saving and sharing of seeds in our unique desert climate. The practice of seed saving has been around for more than 12,000 years. It is a part of our heritage and is now more important than ever in preserving unique seed varieties which have drastically decreased due to commercial seed farming practices. Seed libraries like ours have the potential to secure the future of food in the Desert Southwest through conservation, sharing, and education. bridget SHANAHAN

The Pritchard Gallery will feature Bisbee artist and graphic designer Bridget Shanahan this quarter. Shanahan has lived in Bisbee since 2009 and recently co-founded a design company – Dog Cat Mouse Media. Turning an early interest of art into a graphic design degree from the Art Institute of Pittsburgh, Shanahan has been professionally working as a designer since 2006. Her design career has taken her from the Middle East to Mexico. For this show, Shanahan is featuring paintings from her ongoing cat series, which celebrates all of the cats that have been in her life. She plans on turning the cat portraits into a children’s book someday.

The Pritchard Gallery was opened in 2017 in the Library’s Living Room and features four local artists each year. Ten percent of art sales are donated back to the Library.
