

CHOCOLATE TASTING FEBRUARY 11 at CSP



The Bookstore is run by the Friends and is open during the Library’s regular business hours. Hardback books, DVDs, and CDs are \$1.00 and paperbacks are \$.50. All proceeds benefit the CQ Library.


SOUTHWEST BOOKS OF 2016 ANNOUNCED



The *Southwest Books of the Year: Best Reading 2016* is published by the Pima County Public Library and features 34 books, including 7 books for kids. The Top Picks (those books selected by more than one panelist)

are 10 in number and feature fiction titles, including a new work by TC Boyle (*The Terranauts*) which begins where the real-life Biosphere left off (it’s mission compromised when one of the occupants was released to treat a finger injury and returned with a pizza). Also featured are nonfiction books including Tucson entomologist Justin Schmidt’s *The Sting of the Wild*, the story of a man (Schmidt) “who got stung for science.” Schmidt will be at the Copper Queen Library early in 2017 to talk about his book and his experiences getting stung.

ART BOOK DONATIONS



The Copper Queen Library would like to thank artist Charles Marie for donating over 50 beautiful art books to the library’s collection. From painting and drawing techniques to picture books of artists and their works, the collection is located on the third floor in 700 section of the nonfiction collection.
