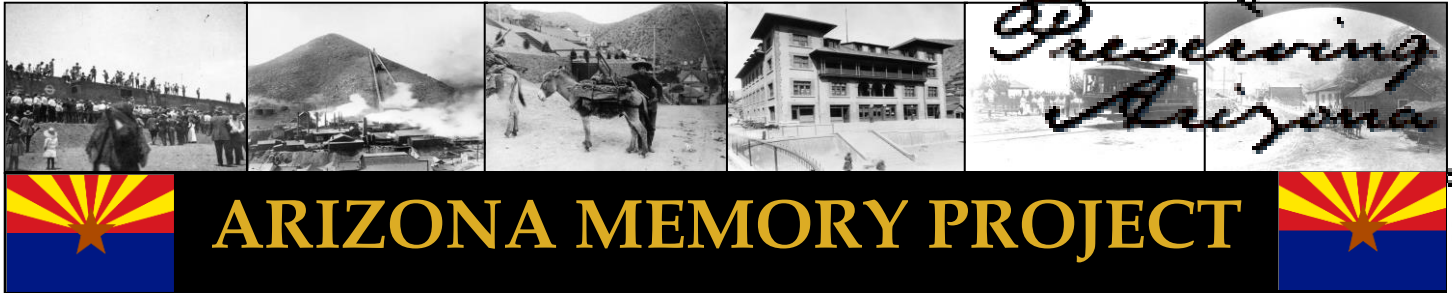

A service of the Arizona State Library, the *Arizona Memory Project* provides access to the wealth of primary sources in Arizona libraries, archives, museums and other cultural institutions. Visitors to the site will find some of the best examples of government documents, photographs, maps, manuscripts, oral histories, streaming music, and lectures that chronicle Arizona's past and present.

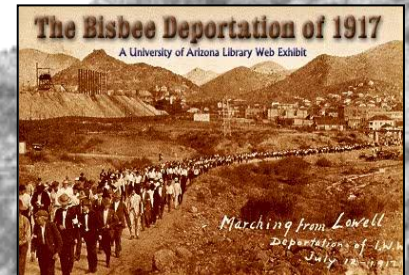


Search over 67,000 digital items related to Arizona history and culture, including over 40,000 photographs.

Experience Bisbee in its early days -- with birds-eye views of Old B, Warren, and Lowell and street scenes of the Gulch and Tombstone Canyon -- and witness the people, places, and excitement of mining life that made Bisbee into the home we call today.

Listen to interviews and family oral histories that describe life in Arizona's early days.

Included in the Project is the University of Arizona's archive of the Bisbee Deportation. Here you will find a collection of primary and secondary sources for the study of the deportation of over 1000 striking miners that occurred in Bisbee on July 12, 1917.

# Arizona Digital Newspaper Program

The Arizona Digital Newspaper Program (ADNP) was created by the National Digital Newspaper Program which is a long term endeavor aimed at creating a nationwide online digital database for historic newspapers published between 1836 and 1922.

Arizona's first newspaper, The Weekly Arizonian out of Tubac, started publication in 1859. During 1859-1922, Arizona's newspapers documented significant historical events that had an enormous impact on the state, its development, and its identity.



**ADNP allows you to easily search 31 AZ newspapers, including:**

- The Bisbee Daily Review (first published in 1901)
- The Weekly Orb (published in Bisbee from 1896-1900)
- The Tombstone Epitaph (first published in 1880)
- The Arizona Republican (first published in Phoenix in 1890)
