

28th ANNUAL CHOCOLATE TASTING SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 9th at CSP

The 28th Annual Chocolate Tasting will be held on Saturday, February 9th from 6:00 – 9:00 PM at the Central School Project, 43 Howell Avenue in Old Bisbee. Tickets are \$15 and may be purchased in advance at the Library, Friends Bookstore, High Desert Market, Finders Keepers, and online at eventbrite.com. Tickets may also be purchased at the door on the night of the event. Come, sample chocolates, mingle, bid on Silent Auction items, and help support the Friends. The Friends use the proceeds of the event to support programming at the Library and promote children’s literacy. Last year, the Friends helped to support the Library’s Fun with Math and Science program, our first Haunted Library, Preschool Story Hour, FreeWrite, our Summer Reading Program, Arizona Humanities Lectures, and much more. The Chocolate Tasting made this news last year when it won Second Place for Best Event/Festival at the 2018 Best of Bisbee Awards sponsored by the Herald/Review Newspaper. This year’s artwork for the poster was generously donated by Mary Jane Bank.

CQ LIBRARY NOMINATED FOR EBSCO EXCELLENCE AWARD

The Copper Queen Library was nominated in December for the EBSCO Excellence in Small and/or Rural Public Library Service Award. The Award provides recognition and a \$1000 honorarium to a public library serving a population of 10,000 or less that demonstrates excellence of service to its community as exemplified by an overall service program or a special program of significant accomplishment. The nomination highlights some of the Library’s new services and programs from the past year, including the Seed Library which opened its catalog of seeds in March; the Library of Things which includes pickleball and bocce ball sets; the LIFI program which allows patrons to check out internet hotspots to use at home or on the road; and the opening of the San Jose Library Annex which extends library services and programs to the San Jose Neighborhood of Bisbee. Award Juries will announce results by March 2019 and Award winners will be recognized at the 2019 ALA Annual Conference in Washington, DC.

FLAMENCO SYNDROME DIRECTED BY BISBEE LOCAL BIJOYINI CHATTERJEE







This film documents the complex encounters between the international flamenco community and resident gitanos (gypsies) in Jerez de la Frontera, a small town in lower Andalusia (Spain). The project also explores how flamenco is a way of life for these communities. Bijoyini Chatterjee is a Bisbee filmmaker, photographer, software architect and flamenco dancer. She trained in Computer Design and Theory from the Government College of India (Pune) and Northeastern University (Boston). She also studied Video/Film production and still photography at Massachusetts College of Art and Design (Boston), School of Museum of Fine Arts (Boston) and Harvard University (Cambridge, USA) while working full time as a software designer/architect at Groove Networks.

MOST NOTABLE BOOKS OF 2018





Each year the editors of the The New York Times Book Review selects the year's most notable fiction, poetry, and nonfiction. Many of the books are already on our shelves including National Book Award Winner, *The Friend*, written by Sigrid Nunez and Richard Powers' *The Overstory*, a story in which people are merely the underbrush and the real protagonists are the trees that the human characters encounter. Noted for Nonfiction include David Blight's monumental biography of Frederick Douglass which gives readers not only the career but also the context that allowed Douglass to enter the White House as an adviser to Abraham Lincoln. And unlike Douglass's own autobiographies, this book takes us inside the Douglass household to show us his complex relationship with the women in his life.

WEDNESDAYS: 10:30 – 11:30 AM


Little Book Club
